Pick out points which present this character/theme and explain how they do this</li> </ul>

An Inspector Calls	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Characters</li> <li>• Themes</li> <li>• How to analyse an extract</li> <li>• Learning quotes</li> <li>• Points on structure, context and dramatic devices</li> <li>• How to structure your essay</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For each character/theme list points on structure and context</li> <li>• Structure – intro, 3-4 x PEEL, conclusion</li> </ul>
Anthology poetry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What happens in each poem/what each poem is about</li> <li>• Comparisons for each poem</li> <li>• Quotes</li> <li>• Points on language, structure and form</li> <li>• How to structure your essay</li> </ul>	<p>As above, plus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For each poem, list 2 poems which you could compare to this poem and explain the comparison</li> </ul>
Unseen poetry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How to analyse an unseen poem/how to pick out points to answer the question</li> <li>• How to identify points on language, structure and form</li> <li>• How to structure your answer</li> <li>• How to deal with a poem which is difficult to understand</li> <li>• How to compare 1 unseen poem to another – what to compare</li> <li>• How to structure your comparison answer</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use the 15 poems in the front of your anthology (Love and relationships) which we haven't used. Choose one at random and annotate to show how it presents love and relationships. Aim to pick out 3-5 main points.</li> <li>• If you are struggling, look for all words/phrases which link to the question. Circle/highlight/underline these and annotate with what they mean/show.</li> <li>• Choose another poem to compare this to. Pick out 2-3</li> </ul>

<p>English Language Paper 1 Q1-4</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How to structure your answer for each question</li> <li>• How to annotate the texts (what to look for in the texts for each question)</li> <li>• How long to spend on each question</li> </ul>	<p>main points of comparison between the poems.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Practice papers – get these from the AQA website or make your own by taking an article from a newspaper and working through the same questions for this article (list 4 facts, language, structure. Etc.)</li> </ul>
<p>Descriptive writing (Paper 1 Q5)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How to write accurately</li> <li>• How to use different techniques in your writing (alliteration, imagery, etc.)</li> <li>• How to vary your writing (different sentence structures, different sentence starters)</li> <li>• How to structure your writing (start by describing the whole scene, then focus on individual parts of the picture, then finish with another overall description)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Find a picture on the internet/in a magazine. Put this in the middle of a piece of paper and label with different descriptions of different parts. Try to use as many different techniques as possible. Write it up.</li> </ul>
<p>English Language Paper 2 Q1-4</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How to structure your answer for each question</li> <li>• How to annotate the texts (what to look for in the texts for each question)</li> <li>• How long to spend on each question</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Same as for Language Paper 1</li> </ul>
<p>Persuasive writing (Paper 2 Q5)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How to write accurately</li> <li>• How to use different techniques in your writing (alliteration, imagery, etc.)</li> <li>• How to vary your writing (different sentence structures, different sentence starters)</li> <li>• How to structure your writing (start by describing the whole scene, then focus on individual parts of the picture, then finish with another overall description)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Come up with a statement that you could agree/disagree with e.g. exams are too difficult. Note down your ideas for whether you agree or disagree and why. For each idea add in a persuasive technique. Write your piece of persuasive writing</li> </ul>
