This week I hand over the briefing to Mr Ballantyne who thought it would be great to share with parents and carers the experience of visiting Number 10 Downing street with Year 8 students:

"Year 8 Students Visit 10 Downing Street

On **Friday, 31st January**, a group of our **Year 8 students** had the incredible opportunity to visit **10 Downing Street** as part of the prestigious **Lessons at No. 10** initiative. Accompanied by four members of staff, the students stepped through the iconic black door and into the heart of the British government, where they experienced a truly memorable day.

The visit began in the **State Dining Room**, where **Mr Clarke** delivered an engaging and interactive lesson on **Winston Churchill**. Students explored Churchill's leadership during World War II, his famous speeches, and his lasting impact on Britain. The session sparked lively discussion, with students demonstrating impressive knowledge, curiosity, and thoughtful contributions. Following the lesson, the group embarked on a guided tour of **Downing Street**, learning about its **rich history, famous residents, and daily operations**. They explored rooms where major decisions shaping the country have been made, gaining a unique insight into the workings of government.

A highlight for many was the chance to meet **Larry, the Chief Mouser**, who has been a Downing Street resident for over a decade. Students were delighted to see the famous feline in his home, adding an extra special touch to the experience.

Throughout the visit, our students represented the school exceptionally well. They showed **great enthusiasm, respect, and impeccable behaviour**, making a fantastic impression on the staff at Downing Street. Their insightful questions and keen engagement were praised by the organisers, and it was clear they made the most of this unique learning experience.

This once in a lifetime visit provided students with a deeper appreciation of British history and government. We are grateful to the **Lessons at No. 10** team for hosting such an inspiring and educational experience, and we are incredibly proud of our students for their exemplary conduct throughout the day."

This is another fine example of the lengths that staff will go to create great opportunities for our students to enrich their thinking and spark their curiosity.



This Saturday marks Zero Discrimination Day 2025. Founded by the United Nations, it promotes inclusion and equality in all UN member countries, and the right of everyone to live a full and productive life.

The day highlights the need to combat inequalities of all kinds: gender, age, health status, sexual orientation, race and class.
